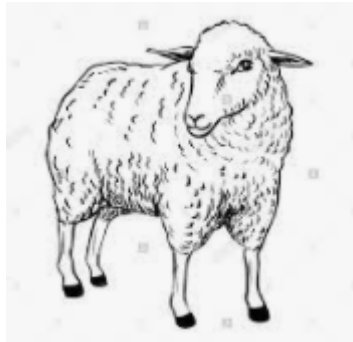
When my Sheep was stolen I was in Town
 very ill and the Police Magistrate wrote
 to me to come to Hamilton I was very very
 bad and confined to bed on the 3rd inst. I left
 town and got to Hamilton on the 4th and
 undertaken the Sheep skins to be made
 the Police Magistrate ordered me to proceed
 to Town and he at the same time wrote
 to the Attorney General I came to Town
 attended the Court for six days before
 the trial came on when it was over
 I applied to the Clerk for my expenses I
 was asked for my summons I related what
 I have above stated in presence of Mr.
 McDowell who said he would certify at any
 time or give me the Summons that was
 issued for me but not served next day
 I called and got the summons and when
 I presented it the Clerk told me that
he could not allow me any expenses

If this is the way that I am to be
 treated it will be better for me when I
 get my Sheep stolen never to say one word
 about it for it makes the loss double to come
 to town to prosecute and get no expenses

I must leave town to stay about ten weeks
and I thought it proper to inform your Honor
how I have been treated I have

I am informed by Mr. John
Furrier that there is a report going

I am concerned in Sheep Stealing
and was expected to come to
the Jail every day - I am certain
that whoever is the author of such
a report is a d - n - d. liar; and
as for having any dealings with
Farquarson he is the man I never
spoke to in my life - nor with
any Sheep Stealer in the country
nor never will - whatever will

become of me I shall keep
myself honest - Will you
be kind enough to do what
you can to find out the
author of this injurious report;
I think it is my good friend,
W. W. - I am a little hurt
to think that such a report
should be going abroad about
me - when I am innocent.

I shall be in town in the course
of three weeks to look after
out an iron axetree for a
new cart and if you can
get any information as to who
the author is I shall be greatly

obliged to you

I have been out a shepherding
myself these two or three days
and I found two lambs that
had been trode down by a
horse and killed on the
~~spot~~ it has been done some
time ago; I hereby give you
notice that if ever I find, or
hear off, any of your people
either on horse back or foot
going through the run without
^{asking} leave that I may send a
man with to take care of the
sheep I shall send them to
jail - I have drawn off all
my runs and after this
~~state~~ intimation if you allow

any of your Hairy rams to
come among my ewes while
they are on their own run
I shall take the liberty of
cutting them; I would also
advise M. Samuel to ~~keep~~
~~to keep a better tongue~~
~~if he will he shall~~
~~tell the truth in case he~~
