EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR.

Moon's Changes:—● New Moon; ☽ First Quarter; ○ Full Moon; ☾ Last Quarter.
The Moon's Transit at any place is the time when the Moon is on the meridian of that place. It is calculated in the tables given for each month for Melbourne and Hobart. For Auckland, Christchurch, and Dunedin, subtract minutes in end column for each month; for Perth, add the same; for Sydney and Brisbane, subtract one minute; for Adelaide, add one minute.

ECLIPSES IN 1891.

Of Sun, Two; of Moon, Two:—
I.—MAY 23rd. A Total Eclipse of the Moon, visible generally in the west part of the Pacific Ocean, and in Australia, Asia, Africa and Europe. Moon enters penumbra 3^h 36^m P.M.; total eclipse begins 5^h 49^m P.M.; ends 7^h 9^m P.M. At London the Moon rises three-quarters of an hour after the end of the total phase.
II.—JUNE 6th. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun. A partial eclipse will be visible in part of N. America, Siberia, and Europe (except a part of the Peninsula). Begins at London 5^h 2^m P.M.; ends 6^h 24^m P.M.
III.—NOVEMBER 15th and 16th. A Total Eclipse of the Moon. Visible generally in Asia, Africa, Europe, Atlantic, N. and S. America, and the east part of the Pacific. Begins 11^h 37^m P.M.; ends 1^h 1^m A.M.
IV.—DECEMBER 1st. A Partial Eclipse of the Sun, visible only in the south part of S. America. Begins 9^h 44^m A.M.; ends 1^h 18^m P.M.

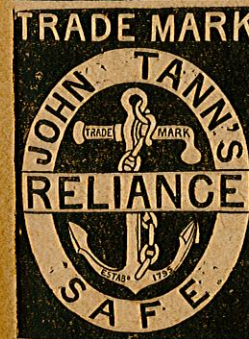
