J. E. Walker (1841-1899) solicitor, son of George Washington Walker and Sarah benson Walker, Quakers, was interested in the history and eography of Tasmania. he gave many talks to the Royal Society of Tasmania and others. He was a fellow of the Royal Geographical Society, London.

His notes, draft articles, newspaper cuttings etc were presented to the Royal Society of Tasmania by his sisters in 1920

Walk to Macquarie Harbour by a new track via Derwent Bridge, Lake St.Clair, Nt. Lyell, led by C.F. Sprent. The party included, as well as J.B. Walker, R.M. Johnston, A. Giblin, bailly, Perrin, Col. J.V.Legge and Piguenit (the last two only as far as Collingwood Valley). Lost of the party then walked on to Waratah and returned by train via the North Coast and Launceston.
