BOARD OF EXAMINERS - PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS

School examinations for scholarships and intermediate and leaving exams.

The University of Tasmania, on establishment, took over the functions of the Tasmanian Council of Education (see UT.17) and so after 1890 the Tasmanian Scholarship and Exhibition Exams. ceased and were replaced by Senior and Junior Public Exams. run by the University. Matriculation qualification and University and secondary school scholarships and exhibitions were awarded on the results of these. In 1922 the names of the examinations were changed to Intermediate (i.e. the lower exam. for a general certificate for candidates of c.16) and Leaving (the senior exam. for a higher certificate for candidates of c.18 years). The Intermediate exam., however, ceased to be held after 1939.

In 1946, under the Education Act, 1944, an independent Schools Board was established to run the school and higher school certificate exams. although the Registrar acted as Secretary to the Board for a time. University matriculation could be gained by passing English and five other subjects at the Schools Board exams. but the University also continued to set its own alternative matriculation exam. (including higher certificate level) until 1969, when the Schools Board took responsibility for all secondary school exams.

Lists of successful candidates, with subjects, marks, age and school, and also examiners' reports and copies of the exam. papers (except supplementary papers) were published in the University's Public Exam. Manual for the following year, and lists of the candidates passing and details of examinations in the University Calendars (see Uni. Pubs. P.1/19).

This Board was first set up on 25 October 1901. Examiners were appointed annually by the Council on the nomination of the Board of Studies. Professors and others appointed Examiners by the Board of Studies constituted the Board of Public Examinations, the Special Examinations qualifying for Matriculation and the First Examination in Pure and Applied Science. It determined "the form of examination returns to be sent in by the various Examiners" and furnished "to the Examiners such information and instructions as may be necessary for the due conduct of the examinations under its charge". In 1917 committees of the Board for various subject groupings were appointed "to review and be responsible for the examination papers, and to deal with such other matters as the Board may direct."

3. MINUTES OF REVISING COMMITTEE 1930-36

On 14 August 1929, at a meeting of the Board of Public Examinations, the Revising Committee was set up, on a motion by Professor E. Morris Miller,

"to review all doubtful cases and to recommend to the Board the allowance of grace marks". Members were appointed by the Chairman of the Board of Public Examinations.

4. MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE OF PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS 1919-1938

17 October 1919 - 10 June 1938.

This Committee was set up in August 1919. Members included the President of the Board of Studies, the Chairman of the Board of Public Examinations, Professors and Lecturers of the University and 10 persons, appointed annually by the Council of the University, engaged in the work of secondary education (including 5 nominated by the Director of Education and 5 nominated by the Principals of Registered Secondary Schools).

The Committee caused "to be published Courses of Study for such subjects of the Public Examinations as it may think fit" and "Details of the subjects of the Public Examinations and the scales of maximum marks, together with lists of books prescribed or recommended, for the Public Examinations to be held in the next year but one". The Committee could "make recommendations to the Board of Studies as to the Public Examinations" and appointed sub-committees to consider and report upon "the Courses of Study and the Details of subjects and books for the Public Examinations". In December 1934 the Committee of Public Examinations became a Committee of the re-organized Board and Committee of Public Examinations, and remained active until 31 March 1939 when the Statute under which it operated was revised.

5. MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE OF EXAMINERS 1935-47.

13 June 1935 - 8 January 1947.

The Committee of Examiners, a Committee of the Board and Committee of Public Examinations, was set up in December 1934. Members included examiners who were Professors or Lecturers "and such other Examiners as the Board may annually appoint". Its functions were "to review and be responsible for the examination papers, to consider examiners' returns and prepare the class list from them, and authorise their publication with the sanction of the Chairman of the Board" and could report to the Board "on any matter connected with the examinations". It appears to have continued until the end of March 1947 when new Matriculation regulations came into force (see Matriculation Manual CP1/19/4).

ENGINEERING BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

In 1919 a committee considered the possibility of the Technical College and the University sharing facilities and staff to run joint courses and in 1922 an agreement was signed between the State Director of Education and the University Council to establish conjoint classes in electrical engineering (extended to engineering and chemistry in 1926) under a Joint Board of Management. The agreement was terminated when the University's engineering and chemistry laboratories were built on the new Sandy Bay site in 1958-9 and the Board's equipment was divided between the University and the Technical College.

The State Superintendent of Technical Education was Secretary and treasurer of the Board and kept the minutes. The only records held by the University are the Registrar's correspondence with the Board, copies of the agreements and some copies of minutes and Requests for the University Council's approval of staff appointments.

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February 1904, and information on German university regulations for matriculation of foreign students (Registrar's corresp). The University Council always returned courteous thanks for the information or suggestions made. Fritz Ernst also continued his journalist activities and apparently some unsigned reports of University Annual Commemoration Days and articles on geology etc in various Tasmanian newspapers were by F.J. Ernst, samples being enclosed with his initial letter of inquiry and his letter of resignation.

In all records, including the matriculation roll and the graduation roll which had to be signed with the full name, the name is written as Fritz Joseph Ernst. This is also the name in the list of graduates in the Calendars until 1933 (after which it is omitted, presumably known to be deceased). There is nothing to indicate that Fritz Joseph Ernst was the same person as Frederick Joseph Ernst-Carrol except a pencil note in the margin of the students qualification register (which unfortunately contains no personal details): "Ernst-Carroll, Frederick Joseph". There is no record of date or place of birth, parents or other personal details. Nor is it known when he came to Australia. It is possible there might be some record in the State Archives As the Chief Secretary's Office provided proof of identity (Archives Office of Tasmania, 91 Murray Street, Hobart, Tas. 7000). Perhaps Sydney University Archives might have a copy of the letter from the Registrar referred to as one of his documentary proofs. It is also possible that the German Archives might have army records (if they survived the wars).

A <u>Frederick</u> Joseph <u>Ernst-Carroll</u>, of Neuchatel, Switzerland, was elected a fellow of the Royal Society of Tasmania on 6 March 1908 (See *Papers & Proceedings* of Roy. Soc.Tas) but there is no correspondence in the society's archives nor did F.J. Ernst-Carroll contibute any articles to *Papers & Proceedings*.
